Competition Intent

Competition Topic

The intent of the center shall be to create awareness about environmental and sustainability issues amongst the student community, kindle their interest, arouse their desire to do something about it and eventually result in action that demonstrates environmental stewardship amongst the future leaders of our nation. How will you go about setting up this center in your school to achieve the goals set. Also elaborate in detail the nuts and bolts of how you propose to achieve this. Apply thought on how you would reach out to all age groups in your school.

Eligibility

Open to all Class IX, X, XI and XII students.

Number of Entries

Any number of students can take part in this initiative. In fact, the more number of students the better. But finally, each school will send 1 entry consolidating the ideas from all the students for this competition.

Submission Requirements

Students need to describe their ideas in an A4 size document (limited to 15 pages) through sketches, drawings, write-ups etc of the various measures they would like to incorporate within their campus. This is your chance to be imaginative and you will be assessed on your ability to communicate information concisely (see assessment criteria below). A teacher's report (no more than 500 words) detailing the process and team dynamics, how many students participated must be enclosed. Also, please include a report on the resources used for this project.

Assessment Criteria

Level 1:

Student submittals will be assessed on the following criteria:

- Originality
- Concept / design
- Content
- Implementability
- Presentation
- Resources employed
- Teacher's report

Last date for getting the entries back from the schools is 10 September 2010.

Level 2:

Top 5 school entries from Level 1 shall be required to present their ideas in front of a select panel of distinguished Judges at Chennai on October 6, 2010. Time and venue shall be intimated later.



Last Date for Submissions for Level 1 is 10 September 2010

AWARD

The award of 7.5 lakh is towards the implementation of the various ideas suggested by them in their own campus. The grant will be available for the winning school through a separate account and shall be used to implement various green ideas suggested by them. An Indian Green Building Council / Yi representative will act as mentor for this school and help them successfully implement these ideas. Runner-up and second runner-up teams shall get certificates and trophies from Yi-IGBC-Carrier. Maximum of 5 students plus 2 faculty members from each of the top 3 schools shall also be invited to the Green Building Congress 2010 to be held in Chennai from 6-9 October 2010. The prizes shall be handed over during the inauguration function. In addition, entries from the top 15 to 20 schools shall also be displayed in an exhibition stall at the Congress for all delegates to view and benefit.

"The winning school shall receive a grant of Rs.7,50,000/- (Rupees Seven Lakhs Fifty Thousand)"

International Green Building Congress

International Green Building Congress is India's flagship event on green buildings is been organized by Indian Green Building Council since 2004. The first event was held in Hyderabad and was inaugurated by the Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister and had several delegates from the construction industry and the government. The 2005 Congress was held in New Delhi and was launched by His Excellency Shri A.P.J Abdul Kalam. President of India.

The 2006 Congress in Bangalore created a record of sorts when over 1000 delegates attended this event. The 2007 Congress was held in Chennai and had the highest ever number of attendees in the country. The 2008 Congress was held in Mumbai with 1300 delegates and participants from various industries segments and sectors. The 2009 Congress was held in Hyderabad and delegates ranging from architects and engineers to international product manufacturers and government representatives participated.
