"Connecting the Last Mile Leader"

My Fellow Leaders

As I write this note, my mind races through 'The Year That Was' and it gives me a great sense of satisfaction and immense pride on how the year panned out, that too despite all the limitations!

When we started the year, the vibrant and enthusiastic team came together to build upon the foundation and ideas of our predecessors. Meticulously, we made a lot of plans to Scale up, Go Digital and Realign Young Indians towards Vision 2030.

To achieve this, we created a 360 degree structure of the organization and classified Awareness, Action and Advocacy into specific roles within the Yi stakeholders and leaders.

Before we could put this in action, entire humankind experienced the meaning of 'Man plans, God laughs". While we were busy making plans, we got hit by the pandemic and how! All these meticulously made plans toppled and actions came to a screeching halt and priorities had to change course in a blink of eye!

We felt like the uncompromising determination was changing to anxiety and fear amongst members. To address this, we came up with a unique leadership program Re-Invent - The Way Ahead; for Chapter Chairs. This was a weeklong intensive program enabling leaders to introspect and reflect on Leadership, Personal Awareness, The Power of Emotions, Values, Limitations & Challenges and Wellness immediately during the onset of debilitating COVID-19.

For our members there was no relenting under any circumstances. Yi took this challenge head on. With the formidable support of the National Management team, the Governing Council and the Chapter Leaders; we immediately swung into action. We put on hold all our plans to rethink, re-evaluate, and replan the entire year.

It is our agility that helped us swiftly adapt to the digital way of connecting, breaking geographical barriers of Zones, States or Regions and bringing Yi closer as one big family. As was the need of the hour, we focused on the immediate community needs and created an action plan for COVID-19 relief work. Our strength, belief, compassion, positivity and empathy were abundantly evident in the extensive relief work undertaken by all chapters impacting approximately 7,14,795 beneficiaries. We implemented projects such as distribution of masks, gloves, sanitizers, foot operated hand wash / sanitizer dispensers, Covid testing booths, disinfectant tunnels,

"Sughadharam", our unique handsfree handwash stations that promote hand wash hygiene along with water conservation. I am happy to share that we installed 34 Sughadharam units in public places like bus stations, railway stations benefitting thousands every day. Our members came forward to help migrant workers and stranded people with ration packets and cooked food packets through our chapter networks, across the country. To optimize our efforts, we used technology to reach out to maximum beneficiaries. We designed a microsite to publicize a Covid Resource Center for quick and easy access to Covid Material Vendors.

Gradually, we found a footing in the post Covid scenario and decided to start work on our Vision 2030. As conceived at the beginning of the year, we planned to work on our flagship projects and verticals with our various stake holders- "MYTRI"

- M Members a strong network of 3388 leaders
- Y Yuva our network of approximately 29,500 university students
- T- Thalir our network of schools
- Ri Our Rural Initiative "Rurban" where we try to empower rural communities

While implementing community projects, increasing membership and consolidating activities towards Vision 2030, we also focused on increasing our reach, both internal and external, to achieve holistic scaling up of the organization with over 3300 activities and initiatives throughout the year

Our approach included the following:

- We classified the National Management Team to forge alliances with subject matter experts, government agencies and International bodies to ensure
 Advocacy by creating White Papers. I take great pride to share that this year we secured a seat on the table of Unicef and We PROTECT Global Alliance.
- To increase internal reach, the Regional Management teams collaborated with the Chapters to scale all projects and initiatives and collate data to substantiate the White Papers.
- Our Chapters are the key which collect the tangible data with pertinent parameters, to help create significant White Papers.
- I am happy to share the increase in Yi reach in the form of 8 new chapters and relaunch of Dehradun, Srinagar and Sikkim chapters
- Our strategic Social Media communication and campaigns designed to reinforce responsible leadership, positivity, engagement, compassion and connectedness have helped us develop a thriving relationship with all our stakeholders throughout the year

We did all we could even in this difficult year for our on-going projects:

Accessibility, Gift an Organ, Road Safety and Masoom. Under Masoom we also organized a 2-day virtual summit with eminent global speakers from across the world on the theme "Future of Keeping Children Safe".

To add to the already impressive repertoire of Yi Projects, we also introduced a new Project: "Climate Change" with a focus on "Water Conservation".

Another initiative introduced on Handloom Day was a project to promote weavers and craftsmen of India's rural communities with an objective to build awareness and create linkages for the weavers and craftsmen of our rural communities across our Chapters and introduce them in the Yi ecosystem.

Not being able to meet our YUVA personally did not deter us. We organized a range of e-activities for them such as Mental Health Awareness Workshops, Skilling in Advance Excel & Logistics, helping with employability and influencing entrepreneurship by introducing Design Thinking Workshops and conducting Huddles and Blue Ocean Dialogues for identifying White Spaces through Innovation. For our rural stakeholders, we launched the much-needed Smart TV program to empower them with digital infrastructure for their schools.

While working for the community, during these tough times, we also ensured that we strengthen our ties and bond with each other as it was important to build a sense of comfort across the Yi family too. We built Peer to Peer Learning through with various Speaker Series, Webinars, Online Workshops. We conducted around countless + digital learning events across Yi. We also added diverse Special Interest Groups to the existing ones of Golf, Running and Book Club. The new SIGs are Cycling, Culinary, Market Investors and Angel Investors.

We also led a 40-member delegation to the G20 YEA 2020 Saudi Arabia Virtual Summit fostering a Growth Network in Yi

We take joy in sharing that our ambitious Yuva Onboarding Process went digital this year and we also launched the much-awaited Yi App. The Yi App is not just a communication platform for members but also a CRM tool to understand the interests of members across our tribe.

It is only the enthusiasm and the relentless dedication and passion of the leaders that we brought together 1800 people to celebrate the Annual Flagship Summit: "Take Pride" virtually on the theme of Youth; not just for two days but for two months giving the members an overall experience of Golf Tournaments, Marathons, Team Building games, exposition and a symposium of Speakers.

I feel a deep sense of gratitude towards my Core Group, who are not only my mentors but also a constant source of inspiration and my support system. We were always heard and motivated by the CII Leadership Mr. Uday Kotak, President, CII and Mr. T V Narendran, President-Designate, CII. 





MASOOM



Young Indians conceived Project MASOOM to keep children safe and it was nationally launched by Kailash Satyarthi, Recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize & Founder, Bachpan Bachao Andolan at Yi annual summit "Takepride" on 12th March 2015. Masoom is one of the key projects of Yi, where we work on various initiatives towards creating awareness on Child Safety and Protection and eliminating child sexual abuse through workshops, campaigns, public rallies and awareness drives across the country. Project Masoom works in partnership with the Childline India Foundation and Arpan and many other noted NGOs to spread awareness about Child Safety. This year Yi partnered with WeProtect Global Alliance, an international movement dedicated to national and global action to end the sexual exploitation of children online; and UNICEF to strengthen Project Masoom in the areas of creating thought leadership, knowledge and capacity building.

The project has come a long way by impacting millions of individuals in the communities and being endorsed by renowned personalities. Under this Project, Yi conducts awareness/sensitisation sessions with children, teachers and parents/caregivers. Yi also collaborates with authorities and administration for support towards our cause and spread awareness about Child Protection to the public by organising campaigns in cities through rallies, hoardings, theatre festivals, carnival for kids, exhibitions, skits, celebration of Yi Masoom day & week and talk shows at radio & TV channels. Young Indians has earmarked 14-20 November as Masoom Week, and 20th November as Masoom Day every year.

The mantra of Project Masoom is "Play Your Part". Whether a parent, a teacher, an employer; everyone has a part to play. It could be by making a phone call to report a concern, taking a safeguarding course, volunteering for Childline, enforcing a Child Protection policy in your organization, or creating an infrastructure for making children safe. We all have a part to play in the fight for a safe and secure childhood for every child.

Yi Project Masoom organised its first ever Yi Masoom Summit 2020 on the theme of Future of Keeping Children Safe on 20 & 21 November 2020. The Summit was attended by Yi members, Teachers, and YUVA members. The 2-days Summit was organised over digital platform involving participation from global though leaders. The purpose of Yi Masoom Summit 2020 was to exchange knowledge, global best practices, innovation, solutions and ideas for keeping children safe from all forms of Child Sexual Abuse (CSA). Thought leaders from Government, corporates, INGOs, change makers, youth and child protection stakeholders were invited to share their knowledge and insight on the subject. Global leaders from UNICEF, WeProtect Global Alliance, ICMEC, SAIEVAC, Microsoft, LEGO, Australian eSafety, Aarambh and Arpan participated to help build value for thought leadership towards keeping children safe and influencing the future of children in India.


























ROAD SAFETY



VERTICAL HIGHLIGHTS AND YEAR SYNOPSIS

Road Safety has been one of the main pillars of Yi for last few years. The importance of safety on the roads in a country like India cannot be overlooked by any organization or individual today.

In India approximately 8000 people are killed in road accidents every year (which is 13% of the total fatalities all over the world). These figures are worrisome and has forced to Yi to build an ecosystem to educate and monitor the drivers, by standers, and other stakeholders. We aim to create awareness among young children so road discipline and safety is part of their ethos from a young age. Topics such as reducing noise pollution, improving driving etiquettes, lane discipline, first aid training are all part of Road Safety. Under the Yi pillar of National Building, Project Road Safety was conceived by CII Young Indians. Our objective is to educate people on the importance of abiding traffic rules and imbibing in them a responsibility to take care of the fellow Indians which is done through below modules

Road Safety modules:

Faristey-

Awareness session for Good Samaritan Act. The purpose of a Good Samaritan law is to provide legal protection to bystanders who come to the aid and rescue of victims of road crashes.

Chota COP project-

To increase awareness on the need of Road Safety among the Children. The project aims to create agents/chota cops who remind parents and others about Road Safety.

HNOP-

HNOP aims to reduce noise pollution especially in cities, giving the message to use vehicular honks only when necessary.

Animal Protection Program-

Rural Road Safety Animal Protection program to protect animals and to avoid accidents with animals on the roads.

In the year 2020, Yi chapters had conducted sessions on Road Safety Modules with Yi Stakeholders and also organized road safety quizzes, open mic with YUVA, social media campaigns (buckle up, helmet, unity for safety, etc.), Emergency Responder sessions, debates, etc.
















Highlights of this engagement included the Virtual Ride & Run - marking 12500 Kms in spreading GAO awareness, Radio & Social Media engagements reaching over 12 lakh people and collecting online pledges.



Climate change looks at addressing on minimizing wastage of water, use recycling procedures and judiciously utilize water consumption in all areas from home to school to offices e.t.c.



There are 5 major categories in disability-visual, hearing, motor, speech and cognitive disability. Disability will affect all of us at some point in life and India has around 80 million people living with disability, which coupled with low literacy, few jobs and widespread social stigma are making differently abled people among the excluded in India.

The number of differently abled people in India is expected to rise sharply due to aging and transportation mishaps hence we at young Indians have recognized this gap and under our new initiative ACCESSIBILITY we undertake initiatives to provide access and equal opportunity to people with special needs.

OBJECTIVE:

We aspire to address the specially abled concerns on a 360 degree basis and strive towards improving the quality of living of the specially abled by primarily creating awarness on :-

- 1. Accessible solutions leading to employability and improved quality of living
- 2. Fostering inclusivity.
- Built Environment-accessibility,
- Transport system accessibility,
- Information communication accessibility / Digital accessibility.



Though out the year we have engaged our 29500 YUVA members in Nation Building Initiatives and Empowering them to build a better Nation.


















LEARNING

















INTERNATIONAL ENGAGEMENT



Yi Guwahati: Yi Amazing Race-2.0




Covid Relief Work




Yi Mumbai's Masoom Book Launch and a Panel discussion on "The Importance of Educating and Sensitising children and parents on Good touch and Bad touch"

Yi Goa Distribution free licenses for MS Office 365 to various Colleges in Goa under the Directorate of Higher Education, Govt of Goa



Yi Indore: Launch of Children Safety Booklet




