

JUNE 2025 | IMPACT IN ACTION




Yi Guwahati transformed the entire month of June 2025 into a Mega Masoom Month, delivering powerful on-ground action and engaging over 2,000 stakeholders in the mission for child safety—both physical and digital.

Through impactful sessions and community engagement, the team ignited conversations and built awareness across the city.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- Total Sessions Conducted: 39
- Children Sensitized: 1,952
- Parents Trained: 60 parents equipped with tools to protect and support their children
- Youth Leadership: 21 Young Leaders trained under the Training of Trainers (ToT) model—creating a new generation of peer advocates for child safety

- 5th June 2025 | World Environment Day

 - 22,000 Thalir students from 14 partner schools
 - 18,000 YUVA students from 10 partner colleges

- Fruit saplings were planted at each campus, symbolizing a collective pledge toward sustainability and long-term environmental responsibility.

LIGHTING THE WAY TO SUSTAINABILITY

Yi Kochi – LED Clinic to Curb Toxic Waste



WHAT

If Yi Kochi, under the Climate Change Vertical in collaboration with Yuva and the Department of Commerce-SF, St. Peter's College, Kolenchery, launched an E-Waste Management initiative—The LED Clinic.

The goal:

To reduce harmful LED waste, promote sustainability, and create a community-driven circular economy model focused on LED bulb and tube repair and redistribution.

HOW

The project was executed in five structured phases

- Awareness: Workshops, door-to-door campaigns, and posters educating the community on e-waste hazards
- Collection: Weekly household visits by students every Saturday to collect damaged LED bulbs
- Repair: Students, trained in LED repair and safety protocols, worked during weekday evenings post-classes
- Redistribution: Repaired units redistributed through Kudumbashree networks and community centers
- **Evaluation:** Ongoing monitoring of collection, repair quality, and community feedback

A unique weekly operational cycle kept the project consistent and communityanchored.

















LIGHTING THE WAY TO SUSTAINABILITY

Yi Kochi – LED Clinic to Curb Toxic Waste



IMPACT

- 500+ damaged LED bulbs and tubes collected and repaired from Ward 6 & 7 of Poothrikka Panchayat
- Reduced harmful e-waste from entering landfills
- Provided low-cost lighting solutions to local households and small businesses
- Fostered awareness and behavioral change among students and the larger community
- Established the college campus as both an e-waste repair center and an awareness/training hub

MUKT ANTI-TOBACCO CAMPAIGN - A LANDMARK INITIATIVE

1st June 2025 | Samanvay Bhawan, Bhopal (Yi Bhopal * Global Smile Foundation)



WHAT

The MUKT Anti-Tobacco Campaign was a large-scale public health initiative aimed at raising awareness and driving action toward a tobacco-free society in Madhya Pradesh.

- The campaign featured a synchronized Anti-Tobacco Pledge across the state.
- At exactly 12:00 PM, people from 228 locations across all 52 districts of Madhya Pradesh joined together in one powerful, coordinated
- The campaign was officially recorded in the Golden Book of World Records for the largest synchronized anti-tobacco pledge.

IPAC

- 42,000+ individuals pledged against tobacco use
- A powerful, state-wide message promoting public health and preventive care
- Established a historic world record—bringing global recognition to the cause
- Sparked conversations and commitment toward long-term behavioral change


