



Regional Rounds: Held in 7 cities—Surat, Kanpur, Jamshedpur, Hyderabad,

Thiruvananthapuram, Madurai, and Guwahati—with 700+ shortlisted students showcasing exceptional leadership and public speaking.

National Finale: Hosted on 15–16 November at the India Habitat Centre (IHC), New Delhi, uniting 116 finalists from 17 states, 44 cities, and 82 schools.



WHAT HAPPENED:

Mangaluru Junction (MAJN) becomes a model accessibility-enabled station under Southern Railways, thanks to a landmark collaboration between Young Indians (Yi), CodeCraft Technologies (CSR), and Anuprayaas. This initiative ensures safe, independent, and dignified travel for persons with Disabilities (PwDs), senior citizens, and mobility-impaired passengers.

HOW:

Key Accessibility Features Installed

For Wheelchair Users/Seniors

- Portable ramps for boarding/alighting
- Informative signage for accessibility features

For Visually Impaired

- QR Code-enabled ISL (Indian Sign Language) video guides
- LED display screens with visual navigation content

For Visually Impaired

- Fixed metallic braille maps at entry
- Braille signage for toilets, counters & rooms
- Braille booklets with station layouts
- Platform tactile tiles and reflective strips (Phase 2)

With over 12.25 lakh annual footfall, Mangaluru Junction is now one of Karnataka's leading models for accessible public infrastructure—ensuring:

- Dignity for travellers
- Reduced travel anxiety for PwDs
- Increased independent navigation
