## Launch of Yi Innovation's IDS 2026

Young Indians Innovation successfully launched IDS 2026 (Ideate | Define | Showcase) through a virtual session held on 7 February 2026. The initiative marks a significant step towards fostering a culture of innovation and problem-solving at the grassroots level across Yi chapters.

Designed as a chapter-driven mission, IDS 2026 focuses on identifying and addressing local problem statements through a structured innovation journey.

Chapters are encouraged to define real-world challenges from their communities, while YUVA students will develop innovative solutions through a hackathon-based approach, followed by pilot implementation for the most promising ideas.

The programme was launched by Mr Arun Rathod, National Chairman – Young Indians, with a special address by Mr Anuj Agarwal, National Vice Chairman – Young Indians.

The session also outlined the programme framework, key timelines, and expectations from the Innovation and YUVA teams across chapters, encouraging active participation to drive impactful solutions.




## Yi National Leadership Sync-Up with Regional Chairs

Young Indians held a focused interaction with Regional Chairs to review progress across chapters over the past two months. While activity momentum remained strong, members emphasised the need to accelerate membership renewals.

Governance also emerged as a key priority, with discussions on strengthening the Code of Conduct, PoSH awareness, and financial transparency. Regional Chairs were encouraged to enhance coordination with EMs and NEMs and drive stronger participation in upcoming Regional Council Meetings



## Yi National Leadership Sync-Up with Regional Mentors



The Regional Mentors' interaction reflected strong momentum across the network, with over 5,500 renewals and 1,500+ activities recorded in the early months of the year.

Mentors also discussed improvements required in the Salesforce renewal process while reaffirming their role in guiding chapters through leadership transitions. Updates across climate, learning, innovation, and youth initiatives highlighted the growing impact of Yi programmes, with mentors committing to deeper engagement during upcoming RCMs.

## Yi National Leadership Sync-Up with NMT

The National Management Team came together to review progress across verticals, reporting 1,259 activities nationwide. Strong outcomes were seen in Road Safety, Thalir, Learning, and YUVA initiatives. Vertical leads shared updates on new partnerships, innovation programmes, accessibility initiatives, and climate action projects.

The discussion also emphasised better documentation through health cards and encouraged stronger NMT participation in Regional Council Meetings to empower chapters and regions.



## Yi National Leadership Sync-Up with Chapter Chairs

The Chapter Chairs' interaction focused on membership momentum and chapter engagement.

With 5,539 renewals already completed, chapters were encouraged to intensify efforts over the next few weeks to reach the national target of 9,000+ members. Discussions also addressed Salesforce-related challenges and the need for improved reporting across Thalir and YUVA initiatives. With 1,259+ activities already conducted, Chairs were urged to sustain momentum and ensure strong participation in upcoming RCMs.

## VERTICAL UPDATES



### Yi Odisha Ability Summit 2026

Yi Odisha Ability Summit 2026 - Bhubaneswar, in collaboration with the SSEPD Department, Govt. of Odisha, charted a clear roadmap for measurable and sustainable impact for PWDs. Three high-impact panel discussions and six expert sessions spanning law and governance, universal access, skilling, inclusive hiring, career pathways, and sports convened more than 20 industry leaders and government officials, 30 corporates, and 350+ beneficiaries.

Yi now advances towards structured collaborations driving inclusive hiring, sensitisation, skill development, accessible infrastructure, sports, and education.



### Yi Kochi United for All Campaign

Yi Kochi, in collaboration with Kerala Blasters FC, brought its “United for All” Accessibility and Inclusion campaign to life as students from Saint Clare’s School for the Speech and Hearing Impaired walked the players onto the field. Broadcast live to lakhs of viewers and acknowledged by match commentators, the initiative placed accessibility and inclusion at the heart of mainstream sports culture, demonstrating how public platforms can amplify meaningful social change. The United for All campaign reflects Yi Kochi’s broader commitment to accessibility-led initiatives, promoting inclusive infrastructure and awareness while advocating for equitable opportunities for persons with disabilities across education, workplaces and public spaces. The event stands as an inspiring example of how strategic partnerships can drive awareness at scale.

## Revival of Sudda Gedda Waterbody – Madhurawada, Vizag

The Sudda Gedda waterbody at Madhurawada, Vizag, was revived through collective community action by Yi Vizag Chapter. Over 32,695 sq. m of invasive species were cleared, 2,500 cu. m desilted and 1,200 cu. m of waste managed.

With new channels, bunds and bird islands, the site now supports rainwater storage, ground-water recharge and biodiversity.



## Yi Sikkim Supports War on Waste Initiative

Gangtok Municipal Corporation has invited Young Indians Sikkim Chapter to serve as an advocate for the War on Waste initiative. The effort underscores the importance of mindset change, waste segregation, and responsible disposal as shared civic responsibilities. The successful cleaning of a local jhora highlights the power of community-led advocacy, reinforcing Yi's commitment to sustainable urban practices and collective environmental stewardship.

## Yi Vadodara E-Waste Collection Drive

Yi Vadodara, in association with its YUVA partner C. K. Shah Vijapurwala Institute of Management (CKSVIM), organised a Mega E-Waste Collection Drive. Through an E-Waste Warrior competition, 60 students mobilised neighbourhoods, institutions, and businesses, collecting nearly 400 kg of e-waste and planting 50 saplings—transforming environmental responsibility into hands-on leadership learning for future managers.



## Yi Bengaluru Session on Menstrual Hygiene Empowerment



Yi Bengaluru's Health Vertical conducted a Menstrual Hygiene Empowerment Session for rural government school students of Grades 7-9, impacting 500 girls. The initiative addressed menstrual health, nutrition, and hygiene while distributing 500 sustainable Naricca reusable period kits, promoting dignity, affordability, environmental responsibility, and confidence.

An AI awareness session further encouraged responsible technology use and future-ready thinking.



## Yi Dehradun Blood Donation Camp

Yi Dehradun's Health Vertical delivered a series of impactful initiatives, including World Cancer Day observance, a Blood Donation Camp, mental health and exam stress sessions.

Bharat Thalir Week activities, a Menstrual Health Workshop, weekly virtual yoga sessions, and the Move & Thrive Fitness Challenge. Collectively, these efforts sensitised and engaged over 2,500 students and stakeholders, promoting holistic health, wellbeing, and preventive awareness.

## Yi Durg Hygiene Awareness at Rural Institute

Advanced student well-being through focused hygiene and mental health initiatives in February 2026. Hygiene awareness at Rungta Public School reached 450 students, followed by an integrated Hygiene and Mental Health programme at Eklavya Model Residential School impacting 410 students.

Through structured sessions on hygiene, nutrition, substance abuse, and exam stress management, Yi Durg cumulatively engaged over 1,650 students—reinforcing preventive health education and emotional resilience.



## G20 Young Entrepreneur Leadership Assembly

The first G20 Young Entrepreneurs' Alliance (G20 YEA) Leadership Assembly (LA) of 2026 was held in Colombo, Sri Lanka. Representing India on behalf of Young Indians, Mr. Monil Parikh, Chair – International Engagement, Yi, participated in the discussions and shared valuable insights during the meeting. One Spirit



## Yi Hyderabad Dil-e-Nadaan Masoom Initiative

Yi Hyderabad Chapter concluded the Dil-e-Nadaan initiative across special schools from 9–20 February 2026, reaching 674 special children.

Through engaging, slow-paced sessions using magic shows, art, music, role plays, visual aids, and sign-language videos, children were sensitised on personal safety in a joyful environment. The initiative impacted 602 hearing- and speech-disabled children and 72 neurodiverse students, earning strong appreciation from schools and parents and paving the way for future sensitisation efforts.



## Yi Kanpur Road Safety Initiative

Yi Kanpur's Road Safety Team, in collaboration with the Police Commissionerate Kanpur Nagar (Traffic), launched a structured e-rickshaw regulation initiative by designating seven routes with distinct colour bands. Spearheaded under the leadership of ADCP Traffic Mr. Rajesh Pandey, the initiative—covering 10,000 e-rickshaws—aims to ease congestion, enhance commuter safety, and promote organized urban mobility across Kanpur.

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## Yi Gurugram Session on Chota Cop

Yi Gurugram, in collaboration with Thalir, organised a Chota Cop Road Safety session on 30 January 2026 at My School. Engaging 42 children through interactive learning, the session covered basic traffic rules, pedestrian safety, road symbols, and responsible road behaviour. Road safety colouring books were distributed, empowering children to become young road safety warriors,

## Yi Chandigarh Session on Chota Cop

As part of Yi Road Safety Week, Yi Chandigarh conducted Road Safety Chota Cop sessions for Class 5 students at Kendriya Vidyalaya. Fifty students were sensitised to basic road safety through interactive, gamified activities. The session, led by Road Safety EC members, was engaging and impactful—reinforcing Yi’s commitment to nurturing responsible road users from a young age.



## Yi Tirupati Awareness session on Road Safety

Yi Tirupati made a significant impact by reaching over 950 students through collaborative initiatives across Yi Road Safety, Thalir, YUVA, and Health verticals. Through Chota Cop, Good Samaritan Law awareness, interactive sessions, quizzes, and poster competitions, students were sensitised on traffic rules, responsible road behaviour, and emergency response. With support from the District Transport Office, Amara Hospital, and Amara Raja Energy & Mobility (Amaron), helmets worth ₹3 lakh were distributed—reinforcing Yi Tirupati’s commitment to safer roads and responsible citizenship.



## Yi Chennai – Road Safety Initiatives

During Bharat Thalir Week, Yi Chennai’s Road Safety vertical organised a range of awareness programmes, specifically targeting Thalir schools in Chennai.

These initiatives emphasised the importance of responsible behaviour on the roads, highlighted the dangers of drug use, and encouraged youth participation in spreading awareness within their communities.

## Yi Sivakasi – Farishtey Session

A Farishtey awareness session was conducted for students of Grades 6, 7, and 8 at SHNV Higher Secondary School in Sivakasi. This initiative impacted a total of 1,147 students.

The session featured resource speakers, including Sivakasi Traffic Police officers Mr. Praveen and Mr. Anand. They provided valuable insights on the ‘Good Samaritan Law’ and essential traffic regulations. Their guidance empowered students to act as responsible citizens, promoting both safety and kindness on the roads.

## Yi Chennai Farishtey Session

Yi conducted a Road Safety and Farishtey Awareness session at Sairam Matriculation Higher Secondary School, Chennai, on 9 February 2026. Engaging 71 Thalir students through an interactive format, the session focused on safe road practices, emergency response, and responsible citizenship, empowering students to support accident victims and promote safer communities.

YUVA organised the Entrepreneurship YUVA Mega Job Fair on 14 February 2026.



## Yi Jaipur's Entrepreneurship

Yi Jaipur's Entrepreneurship Vertical alongwith YUVA, conducted the ICFAI Industry Immersion Initiative from 17-19 Feb 2026, impacting 223 UG students of ICFAI University, Jaipur.

Visits across manufacturing, ESG, FMCG, and publishing sectors offered hands-on exposure to operations, sustainability practices, and entrepreneurial scaling through direct industry interactions.



## Yi Chapter Leadership Interaction with National Vice Chairman

Young Indians Co-Chairs from across the country came together for a high-energy national call led by Yi National Vice Chair-Mr Anuj Agarwal, along with the LA team.



The session marked the unveiling of the cohort name Jubilyians, celebrating Yi's jubilee legacy and future vision. Interactive breakout discussions led by volunteer captains enabled candid dialogue on governance, leadership values, accountability, member engagement, and role clarity—reinforcing collaboration, alignment, and a shared commitment to collective growth.

## SPOTLIGHT

### Yi Guwahati Awareness session on Mera Vote Mera Bharat

At NCPEDP's Mera Vote Mera Bharat advocacy event in Guwahati, co-hosted with Young Indians Guwahati, over 130 persons with disabilities,

30 Yi members, and 25 cross-sector leaders came together from across Assam. With key government bodies, industry associations, and civic institutions in attendance, the collective deliberations culminated in a robust Charter of Demands to advance inclusive and accessible electoral reform in the state.



### Yi Kanpur Car Rally on Road Safety

Yi Kanpur launched a high-energy Road Safety Awareness Car Rally, turning city roads into a movement for responsible driving.

Featuring 25 cars, 100 participants, and 10 checkpoints, the four-hour rally generated nearly 1,000 social media engagements. Flagged off by ADCP Traffic Mr. Rajesh Pandey and graced by Mrs. Shiva Singh, IPS, the initiative amplified road safety awareness across generations.

### Yi Delhi Visit to the New Parliament

Yi Delhi organised a visit to the New Parliament on 19 February 2026 with 50 members participating from Delhi and other chapters.

The experience offered firsthand insights into parliamentary functioning, complemented by expert sessions on the New Income Tax Act by senior IRS officers, enhancing members' understanding of policy reforms and governance.



## Yi Indore Awareness Session on Make Healthy Choices

Yi Indore’s Rural Vertical conducted an awareness session on “Make Healthy Choices – Nutrition & Drug Awareness” on 20 February 2026 at Musakhedi, Indore. Engaging 79 children through interactive games and activity-based learning, the initiative promoted healthy lifestyle choices and early awareness in a fun, experiential environment.



## Yi Bengaluru Udhyaami Naari

Yi Bengaluru organised Udhyaami Naari on 5 February 2026 to build awareness among rural women, including domestic workers and street vendors.

The session simplified government schemes such as MUDRA loans and the Udyogini Scheme, using practical explanations and a mock “My Business; My Loan” application to promote financial inclusion and entrepreneurship.

## Yi Hyderabad Pickleball League

Yi Hyderabad Chapter organised a three-phase Pickleball League—Auction, Main Tournament Day and YUVA Inter-College Championship—at Cross Courts Sporting Arena.

Engaging 80+ players, 100 members and 21 colleges, the initiative featured 90 matches, with live score tracking, blending competitive excellence with strategic networking and youth engagement.

moment special and close to the heart. To celebrate their efforts, we also distributed certificates for their achievements and participation, encouraging their confidence and dreams.



- 220+ confirmed placements and internships offered





# YOUNG INDIANS COLLABORATION
