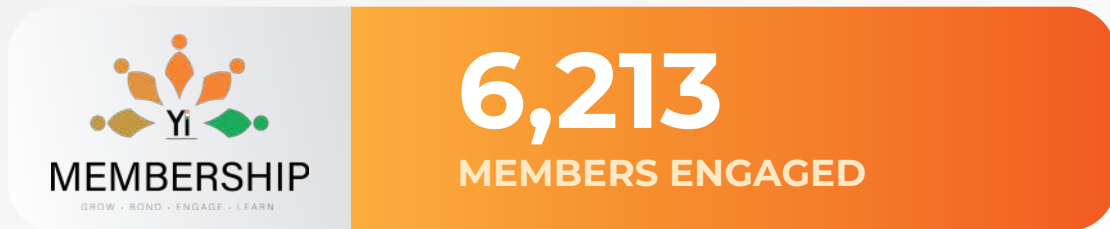

Yi Sivakasi's Idea Sprint 30 : From Classroom to Change-Maker



Yi Sivakasi's BEW Event 30, Idea Sprint: Women Entrepreneur Edition – From Classroom to Change-Maker, held on 10 March 2026 at Mepco Schlenk Engineering College, impacted a record 1,540 female students—the highest in its history. Featuring inspiring sessions by entrepreneurs Sasi Dharani and Ishwarya Adeendran, the event highlighted the importance of innovation, resilience, and confidence in building ventures. Students were encouraged to think beyond conventional careers and pursue entrepreneurship as a pathway to meaningful impact. The program also recognized five women-led startup teams for successfully completing their ideation and prototype stages. Overall, the session served as a powerful platform to inspire, educate, and empower young women to become future change-makers, reinforcing commitment to nation-building and youth leadership.

Yi Erode Driving Innovation Through a 2-Day AI Appathon

Yi Erode in partnership with JKKN YUVA, conducted a record-setting 2-day AI Appathon during Bharat Entrepreneurship Week 2026, engaging 5,000+ students across 9 institutions and 44 departments, with over 60% women participation. Held on March 8–9 alongside International Women's Day, the event saw teams build AI-driven solutions to real-world challenges within 32 hours. The projects were evaluated by industry experts, with several moving toward real-world deployment. The initiative also led to the incubation of nearly 300 student startups, strengthening the entrepreneurial ecosystem. Overall, it showcased the power of youth, innovation, and entrepreneurship in driving impactful change.



Yi Siliguri Yuva Study visit to Star Cement

Yi Siliguri organised an insightful industrial visit for 35 YUVA students from Salesian College to the clinker grinding unit of Star Cement at Mohitnagar, Jalpaiguri. The facility, with a daily grinding capacity of 8,000 MT, offered students a valuable opportunity to witness large-scale manufacturing operations firsthand. During the visit, the plant team walked the students through various stages of the cement production process, including clinker grinding, blending, quality control, and packaging. The visit aimed to bridge the gap between classroom learning and real-world industrial exposure, helping students understand operational efficiency, supply chain dynamics, and the scale at which modern manufacturing units operate.



Yi Rajkot Poster Making for Entrepreneurial Aspirations

Yi Rajkot organized an engaging and insightful session at Bharat School, Rajkot, led by Harshel Manwani, aimed at nurturing entrepreneurial thinking among young students. Participants from Grades 10–12 were provided with a blank canvas and guided to create vision boards reflecting their goals and aspirations. The initiative emphasized building entrepreneurial spirit from the grassroots level. Held on 07 March 2026 under the Entrepreneurship vertical in partnership with Thalir, the session engaged 10+ students and inspired them to think creatively and confidently about their future.
